We all know people who have been affected by the recession, and some of us may have family members, friends, neighbors and colleagues who've struggled to put food on their tables as they lost good jobs and cherished homes.

That's why we are so grateful for your support, and we thank you for your gift of \$500.00 received on March 16, 2010. Your generosity will make a difference in the lives of hungry people in Oregon and Clark County, Washington.

The demand for emergency food in Oregon and Southwest Washington continues to grow, and - thanks to your contribution - Oregon Food Bank continues to be able to meet this staggering demand for food. Each dollar of your contribution allows OFB to distribute five pounds of food to the OFB Network, from Ontario to Astoria, from Vancouver to Klamath Falls.

Through our partner agencies - now more than 930 strong - distribution of emergency food has skyrocketed to historic highs. In the last fiscal year, 897,000 emergency food boxes were distributed. This unprecedented 14% increase has a human face: more than 240,000 people ate meals from an emergency food box each month during 2008-09, including 85,000 children.

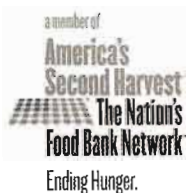

Dear Skip,

It is not through emergency bed spaces and case management that people change their lives. It is through the process of creating permanent, stable relationships. The real work we do at Sisters is the practice of nonviolence and gentle personalism.

When I came here, I didn't have a place to live. My first day the floor manager assigned me to bathroom cleaning and also set me up to use Sisters as my mailing address for Food Stamps. I came back the next day and she remembered my name! That was really important because in other places nobody remembered my name. Everyone was really kind to me and so I came back.

At Sisters I was allowed to be me and I wasn't turned away when my life wasn't going well. The philosophies about how to treat people are like my own beliefs and so that's easy. I've had problems and you guys have helped me with them. I'm a totally different person than when I came in here and this has been at least 50 percent of my recovery. - a former Job Trainee

We strive to change the structures of violence in our society that would have us believe we are so different from one another. Thank you for helping us to lend the strength of dignity to people when they need it most.
